section were done as well as touching up some areas on the glass work. Had to reverse engineer all new control surfaces as they were missing. I also added side scoops, exhaust vents, and service hatches. I ordered a canopy from Zirolì.

At this point I'm touching everything up with spot putty and getting it ready to add panel lines and primer. I have some aluminum epoxy paint on order. Plan on painting it the "Bonnie" color scheme using Callie Graphics. Paul
